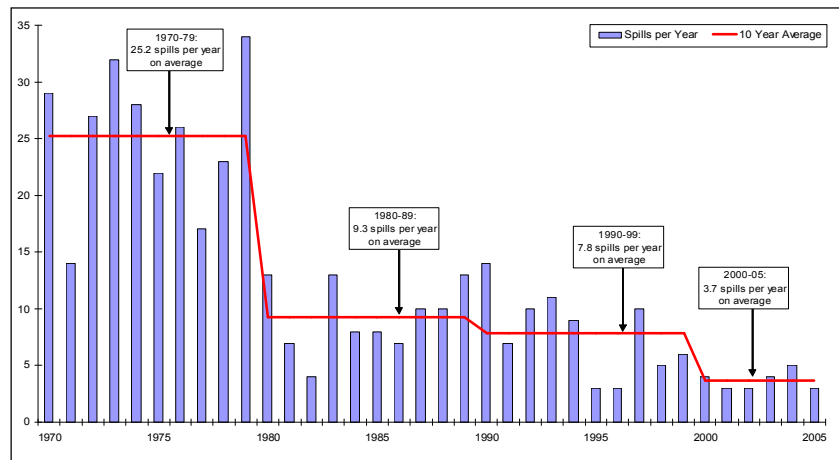

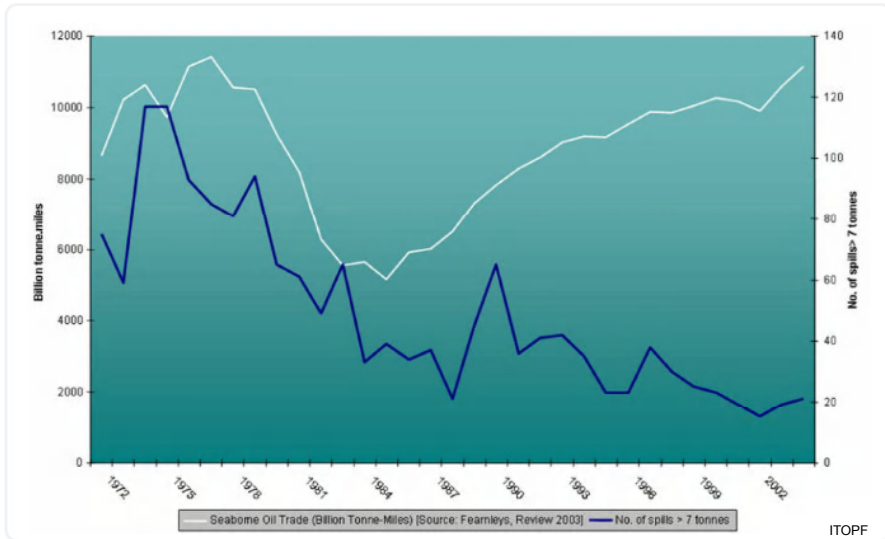
Oil Tanker Spills – a 35 yr trend

Number of Oil Spills of 700 Tonnes



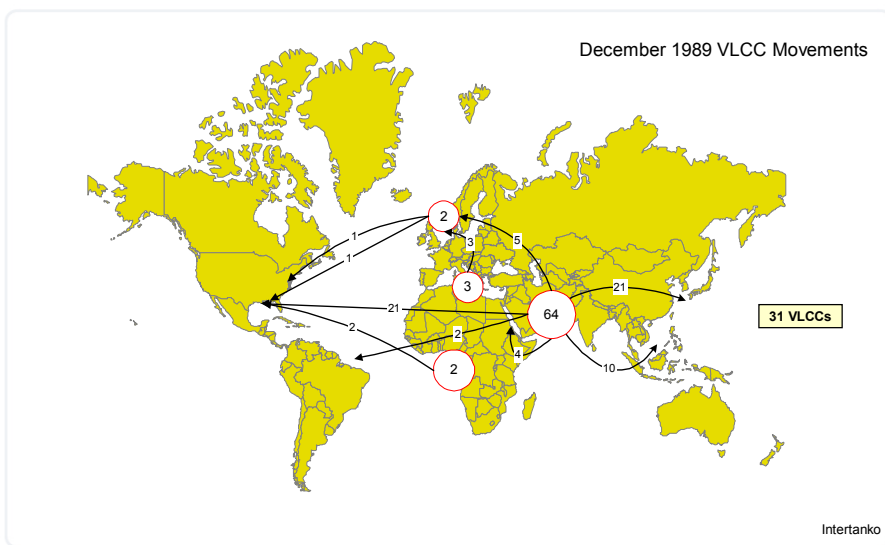

Seaborne Oil Trade 1972 – 2004



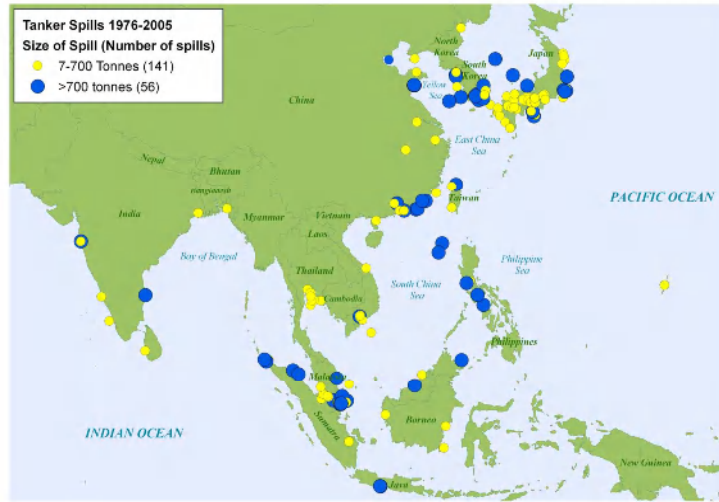

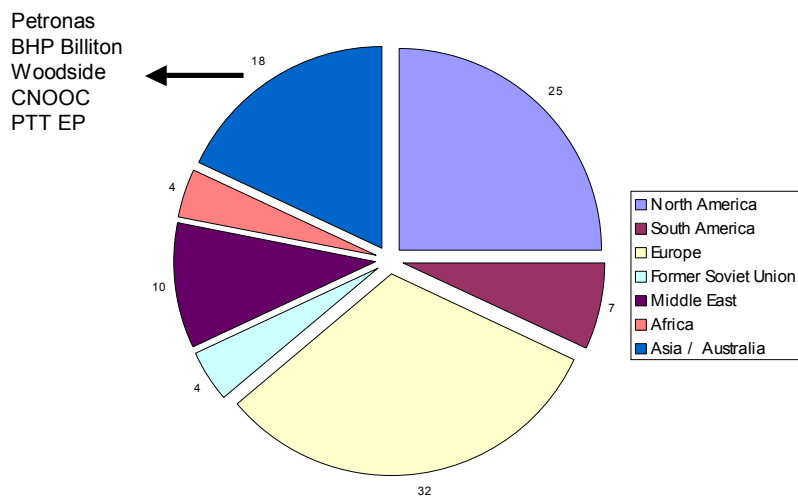

Introduction to IPIECA



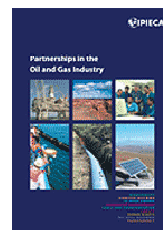
- Global association improving environmental and social performance in the oil and gas industry

OSWG Key messages



- Damage minimisation in oil spill clean up – Net Environmental Benefit Analysis (NEBA)
- Promotion of the Tiered Response Concept;
- Support for national and regional implementation of
 - International Conventions (Oil Pollution Preparedness Response and Cooperation Convention (OPRC); Civil Liability Convention & Fund)
 - Regional Agreements on oil spill preparedness and response



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IMO/IPIECA Global Initiative



- IMO/IPIECA Global Initiative (GI) partnership aims to improve and sustain the capacity of developing countries to protect their maritime and coastal resources at risk from an oil spill incident

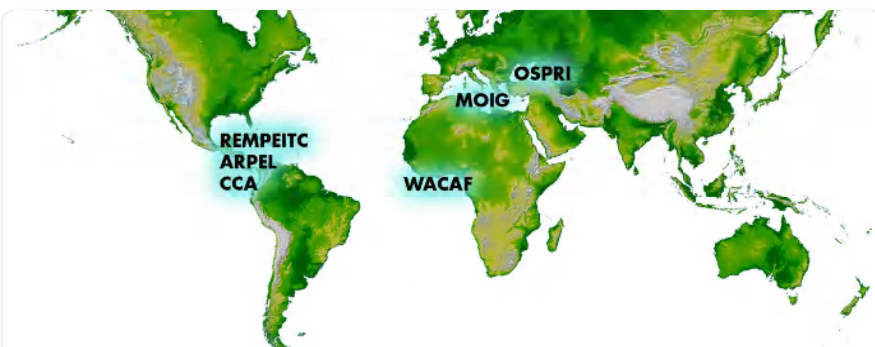
- Methodology:

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Global Initiative at Regional Level



- Delivery of high-level Global Initiative aims can only be assured at the regional & national level
- Sustainability and success of the Global Initiative is maintained in the various active regions through
 - **dedicated focal points** in priority locations around the world facilitating follow up work
 - **Active support from most senior policy makers and managers** in both government and industry, as well as those directly responsible for implementation of national contingency plans

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Beijing GI Workshop Recommendations



- General Recommendation
 - Establish a platform at the national level
- Contingency Planning
 - Compatibility between national plans
 - Compensation system
 - HNS
- Response Arrangements
 - Clarification of Tier 3 arrangements
 - Encourage national response system for third party spills
 - IPIECA assistance on strengthening Tier 2
- Capacity Building
 - Joint training opportunities including joint exercises
 - IMO support for integration of China/NOWPAP plans

- IMO/IPIECA Regional Workshop
- 26 March 2007 - Perth, Australia
- Oil spill preparedness and response in the East Asian Seas Region
 - Developing a strategy for strengthening capability
- The purpose of the workshop is to:
 - Hear directly from informed regional and country representatives about the regional risks and opportunities to improve capability
 - Build on the recommendations from the East Asia Seas Congress, to identify positive steps to strengthen regional preparedness
 - Discuss possible initiatives to further enhance capability
